This is just the last information about the European Shakuhachi Society's Shakuhachi Summer School 2011 at SOAS, University of London's Vernon Square Campus in London. It will take place 28 - 31 July.

We still hope for more last moment participants. If you are hesitating: COME ON ALONG!!!! It will be a great event and a rare opportunity to try to play Min'yo shakuhachi (shakuhachi in folk song) taught by a grand master in this genre, Endo Yoshihiro.

Chiku Za will teach shakuhachi making but that course is already fully booked.

Otherwise there are new genres such as shakuhachi in Enka taught by Hazuki Demachi and all the honkyoku, sankyoku and shinkyoku taught by top European shakuhachi players and teachers such as Verunique Piron, Michael Soumei Coxall Horacio Curti, Daniel Liferman.

We have pre- and post -event dinners organised and we hope to all be able to go out and eat together and that way get to know shakuhachi players from all over Europe. Each evening we have concerts, 2 x teachers concerts, an open mic night on the first evening and a student concert in the grand finale.

For those of you planning to stay longer in London after the Summer School, please come to this charity concert on Monday 1 August.
