Dear teacher/speaker at the European Shakuhachi Summer School 2011 in London.

We would like to use this occasion for more detailed information about the event:

### THE VENUE:

The Summer School will take place at SOAS, University of London's Vernon Square Campus near London St Pancras, King's Cross and Angel stations.

A map is attached in this email where you can see A) SOAS Vernon Square Campus where the Summer School will take place, B) Dinwiddy House, C) Paul Robeson House, D) King's Cross St Pancras Pentonville Road Exit. To the left of that you can see King's Cross St Pancras Stations.

### PAUL ROBESON HOUSE ACCOMMODATION:

The accommodation this year is Paul Robeson House – SOAS' student housing. The nearest stations are London St Pancras, King's Cross and Angel stations. The address is: Paul Robeson House, 1 Penton Rise, London WC1X 9EH, UK. If you arrive to King's Cross St Pancras station – look for signs for the Pentonville Road exit already on the platform. If you find that exit Paul Robeson House is close and easy to get to. Turn right onto Pentonville Road and keep walking straight. If you arrive with the train to St Pancras find the Euston Road Exit and walk towards King's Cross station and ask for Pentonville Road when you are at King's Cross station.

REMEMBER: You have check in at Dinwiddy House, 189 -205 Pentonville Road London N1 9NF and get your the to your room. Paul Robeson House do not have an office.

REMEMBER ALSO: Please do bring beddings – that includes duvet, sheet, pillow and also towels!!!! Paul Robeson House has no service. Beddings and towels will be provided for Endo, Kodama and Jose only.
